Of the Gulf of Lion

Natural Marine Park

Thanks to the introduction of mooring zone, fewer than 70 anchorages were observed in the Anse de Sainte Catherine in 2022, compared with several hundred in previous years!

Help us preserve biodiversity!





Mooring zones are protected areas put in place to preserve the meadows of posidonia and fragile habitats such as coralligenous reefs.



In the mooring areas managed by the Park, anchoring is prohibited all year and

52 buoys

are installed between april and november





Mooring is free.

It is allowed at night and limited to 4 hours during the day.





The buoys color determines the priority:



Red buoys for **divers**



Blue buoys for **passenger ship**



White buoys for boaters

You can moor at all buoys but you have to give way to **priority ship**.



For everyone's safety, speed is limited to <u>3 knots</u> in these areas. It is only allowed to navigate there to take or leave a buoys.


All the buoys are taken?

Get two on a buoy!

Ask a boat already moored to a buoy if you can moor on its edge or at the back.

(respecting a maximum length of 20 meters)
